ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS

Boston Common Garage Pay On Foot Conversion

The Massachusetts Convention Center Authority (the "Authority") will receive sealed bids for the Boston Common Garage's Pay on Foot Conversion Contract at the offices of the Authority at 415 Summer Street, Boston, Massachusetts 02210, until 12:00 noon local time on June 2, 2010, immediately after which, in a designated room, the bids will be opened and read publicly.

This contract includes providing all labor, materials and equipment necessary for the installation of a new PARC-system at the Boston Common Garage. Work includes, but is not limited to, coordinating installation of equipment with PARC equipment supplier, providing electrical and tel/data service, selective demolition, new concrete raised slabs and repair waterproofing as required all as more fully set forth in the Specifications and Drawings

A pre-bid conference will be held at 11:00 a.m. on Wednesday, May 19, 2010 at the Boston Common Garage, Zero Charles Street, Boston. Bidders will have an opportunity to visit the site of the work after the pre-bid conference.

Questions or requests for information, clarification or interpretation of the bidding documents must be submitted in writing in accordance with the Instructions to Bidders and must be received no later than 5 p.m., May 21, 2010.

Contract documents for bidders will be available on or after May 12, 2010, from the Authority at the Administrative Office, 415 Summer Street, Boston, Massachusetts. The documents may be examined free of charge at the foregoing address, and each bidder may obtain one set of the documents at such address, together with any addenda or amendments which the Authority may issue. Additional sets of the documents will be available at the cost of reproduction.

Each bid shall be submitted and will be considered in accordance with the Instructions to Bidders and other Contract Documents, and shall be accompanied by a bid deposit in the amount of 5% of the value of the bid.

The Authority reserves the right to waive any informality in or to reject any or all bids if it be in the public interest to do so. The Authority reserves the right to cancel this procurement at any time without liability to any bidder or other party.

The successful general bidder will be required to furnish a payment bond as set forth in the bid form. Attention is called to the minimum rates of wages to be paid on the work as determined under the provisions of Chapter 149, Massachusetts General Laws, Sections 26 to 27D, inclusive, as amended, and as set forth in the Contract Documents, which the contractor will be required to pay.
